


Mena Dhu - A comic novel set in Cornwall, a sequel to 'One and All'.

Did you know?...

Before radio and television, storytelling was a major source of cheap entertainment for the masses, filling the long dark nights around the fireside or for children at bedtime.

In England we tend to call this type of fiction 'fairy tales' but the German term 'Marchen' is not restricted to children's diversion and encompasses audiences of all ages.

'Puss in Boots' is a story that appears across Europe, in France as 'Le Chat botte', Italy as 'Il gatto con gli stivali' and in Germany as 'Der gestiefelte Kater'. Many of our stories, this one included, were written down by the Frenchman Charles Perrault at the end of the seventeenth century, although the Brothers Grim collected many from the Black Forest in Germany and of course, Hans Christian Anderson famously wrote his own.


In recent times, many of these stories have been gloriously hi-jacked by the series of 'Shrek' films, with Puss, voiced by Antonio Banderas, proving so popular as to generate two sequels.


Tonight we are reverting to the more traditional version, albeit with a few special variations of our own!

... the history of pantomime

British pantomime is an ever-evolving art form; it also seems to be restricted to the English-speaking world-the Americans don't understand it at all. A 'Pantomime', in the Roman world, was originally one silent actor, think Marcel Marceau. We trace what we call 'pantomime' back to a group of Italian actors in the 16th century whose style was called 'commedia dell'arte' (literally play by professionals), stock characters, wearing recognisable masks improvising as they performed, Actors would specialise in characters such as Harlequin, Columbine, Scaramouche and the Captain. A company settled in Paris in the 17th century, establishing what would become the Comedie Francaise and, after the re-opening of the theatres in England following the Restoration, they also toured England, unconsciously sowing the seeds of our pantomime. No-one today would recognise those seeds, as the medium regularly changed, introducing songs and dance, and characters such as the Dame, the Principal boy/girl and the pantomime villain. The nineteenth century, with the building of the larger theatres, such as Drury Lane and the Palladium saw the development of more elaborate staging and also the basing of the story-lines, such as they were, on folk and fairy tales from Europe and the Middle East.


Nowadays, professional pantomime continues to develop, with stars from TV headlining and fantastic technical feats-flying, pyrotechnics and set design continuing to impress; however, alongside the professional razzmatazz there is also, thankfully, a healthy amateur panto culture with very many village companies such as ours delighting audiences with home-grown shows.




